SUBJECT: PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2026-015 - AN ORDINANCE REPEALING
ORDINANCE NO. 10, SERIES OF 2017, AND ENACTING A NEW CURFEW
ORDINANCE FOR MINORS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF NAIC, CAVITE, AND
PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

The joint committee meeting was called to order at exactly 2:22 PM by the Committee Chairperson Roger N. Camilo. The MLGOO Ms. Christine B. Sierra, Plt. Renz Rumbaoa & Plt. Angelene Hernandez representative from Naic Municipal Police Station (MPS), Liga Board of Directors and Councilor Glennon I. Pegollo was present and participated in the meeting. Committee Chairperson Roger N. Camilo stated that the meeting was convened to deliberate on a proposed ordinance pursuant to the mandate of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) under Memorandum Circular No. 2026-029 entitled “*Encouraging the Enactment of Local Ordinances for Safer Cities: A Call to Action for Local Government Units.*”

The proposed ordinance No. 2026-015 entitled: “*An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance No. 10, Series of 2017, and Enacting a New Curfew Ordinance for Minors in the Municipality of Naic, Cavite, and Providing Penalties for Violations Thereof*” was presented and read before the body. It was explained that the measure seeks to review and strengthen the existing curfew regulations for minors within the Municipality of Naic, Cavite. It was further emphasized that under Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991, local government units are mandated to promote the general welfare, including the maintenance of peace and order and the protection of life and property.



The proposed ordinance is likewise aligned with the objectives of the *Safer Cities Initiative*, which aims to ensure safer communities by minimizing the exposure of minors to risks during late-night hours.

During the deliberation, the Committee emphasized that the proposed curfew aims to protect minors from potential harm such as crime, accidents, and other unsafe situations commonly occurring at night.

The ordinance sets the curfew hours from 10:00 PM to 4:00 AM and provides exemptions for minors under legitimate circumstances, including:

- Those accompanied by parents or guardians
- Those attending school or religious activities
- Those responding to emergencies
- Those engaged in authorized employment
- Those traveling with adults

The Committee reviewed the penalty provisions under Section 6 of the proposed ordinance, which impose progressive sanctions:

- **First Offense:**
Four (4) days of community service, with two (2) hours per day
- **Second Offense:**
Fine of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (₱1,500.00)
plus four (4) days of community service, with two (2) hours per day
- **Third and Succeeding Offenses:**
Fine of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (₱2,500.00)
plus four (4) days of community service, with two (2) hours per day

These graduated penalties are intended to promote discipline, parental responsibility, and compliance while ensuring the welfare and protection of minors.

After thorough deliberation, the committee recommends the approval of the proposed ordinance, as it is deemed necessary, reasonable, and consistent with the mandate to promote general welfare, maintain peace and order, and ensure the safety and protection of minors in the Municipality of Naic, Cavite.

There being no other matters to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 2:41 PM.
